This is the reason why UNESCO has designated Thessaloniki as a City of Gastronomy, in becoming the first Greek city to join UNESCO's Creative Cities Network for gastronomy. UNESCO has recognized Thessaloniki's traditional culinary practices, vibrant gastronomy community, and local food, among others.

Modiano and Kapani markets are focal points for foodies in Thessaloniki, gathering lively vendors selling fruit, vegetables, meat, fish, spices, nuts and so much more as well as hosting restaurants, delis and cafes. Modiano Market was constructed in the 1920s by architect Eli Modiano with building resembling some Parisian markets and is due to reopen in October, revamped and refreshed.

Discover Alexander the Great's legacy in Vergina

Take a journey to the capital of the ancient Kingdom of Macedonia and explore the burial chamber of Philip II, father of Alexander the Great, in this UNESCO-protected archaeological wonder just an hour from Thessaloniki.

Long known for its royal tombs and Macedonian legacy, ancient Aigai is now the focus of a new, larger museum at Vergina, which is due to open later this year and will bring a groundbreaking digital focus on Alexander the Great.
